- 4. **Job Profile and his suitability** Mr. Satya Narayan Ashopa is entrusted with responsibility of management of the business and affairs of the company. He has over 35 years of experience in field of marketing, accounting, management and administration. The company has been substantially benefited by his vision and professional knowledge. Mr. Satya Narayan Ashopa plays a major role through his leadership and provides strategic inputs to the growth of the company.

Competition, unorganised market, lack of rainfall resulting in poor agricultural output resulted in inadequate Profit of the Company but inspite of that the turnover and the profit is increasing proportionately.
- 2. Step taken or proposed to be taken for improvement: The Company has been taking all measures within its control to maximize efficiencies and optimized cost and to increase turnover. The company has chalked out a road map to increase the profitability by reduction of cost, and to increased sales by approaching new customers and geographies. A Special Resolution seeking approval of members to the appointment of Mr. Satya Narayan Ashopa as Whole-Time Director designated as Whole-time Director & CFO, pursuant to Section 196, 197 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, and the Rules made thereunder read with Section II, Part II of Schedule V to the Act, has been included in the Notice of annual general meeting.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 149(7) of the Companies Act, 2013, the Independent Directors have confirmed to the Company that he or she meets the criteria of Independence laid down in Section 149(6) of the Companies Act, 2013.

Mr. Atma Ram Sharma (DIN: 00506605) retires by rotation and, being eligible, has offered himself for re appointment. A resolution seeking approval of members for his re-appointment has been included in the Notice of annual general meeting.

During the year, the non-executive directors of the Company had no pecuniary relationship or transactions with the Company.

BOARD EVALUATION

Pursuant to the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, peer evaluation of all Board members, annual performance evaluation of its own performance, as well as the evaluation of the working of its Committees of the Board has been carried out. This evaluation is led by the Chairman of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee with specific focus on the performance and effective functioning of the Board. Note:18

A SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

i) Basis of Preparation

These Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India under Historical cost convention on accrual basis. These financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with the accounting standards notified under section 2(2) and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or not-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013 ("The Act"). For the Company there is generally no clear identifiable normal operating cycle and hence the normal operating cycle for the Company is assumed to have duration of 12 months.

ii) Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost or as revalued less accumulated depreciation. The cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to working condition for its intended use. Expenditure for additions, modifications, improvements and renewals is capitalised and expenditure for maintenance and repairs is charged to the Statement of Profit & Loss. When assets are sold or discarded, their cost and accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts and any gain or loss resulting from their disposal is included in the Statement of Profit & Loss. When fixed assets are revalued, any surplus on revaluation is credited to the Capital Reserve.

iii) Depreciation

Depreciation has been provided as per the rates specified for written down value method in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

iv) Investments

Investments are stated at cost.

v) Inventories

Inventories are valued at cost or market price whichever is lower.

vi) Gratuity, Leave Salary & Wages

Gratuity,Leave salary have not been computed by actuarial valuation as per the Accounting Standard 15. However no gratuity is payable to any employee. Leave salary is accounted for during the year.

vii) Recognition of Income & Expenditure

All expenses and income to the extent considered payable and receivable respectively unless specifically stated to be otherwise are accounted for on mercantile basis.

viii Sales

Sales are recognized on passing of property in goods as per the terms of sale comprises invoice value of goods excluding sales tax and net of discount and/or return wherever considered necessary.

ix) Income Tax

Provision is made for income tax liability estimated to arise on the results for the year at the current rate of tax in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Deferred Income Tax is provided, using the liability method, on all temporary differences at the Balance Sheet date between the tax basis of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts for financial reporting purpose.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that there is a reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable profits will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

Deferred Tax Assets and Liabilities are measured using the tax rates and the tax laws that have been enacted or subsequently enacted at the Balance Sheet date.

x) Impairment of Assets

At each balance sheet date, the management reviews the carrying amount of its assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets were impaired. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated in order to determine the extent of impairment loss. Recoverable amount is the higher of an assets net selling price and value in use.

Reversal of impairment loss is recognized immediately in the Statement of Profit & Loss.

xi) Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Contingent Liabilities are not recognised but disclosed in the notes. Contingent Assets are neither recognised nor disclosed in the financial statements.
